

HIGH SCHOOL NEWS

Gr 9 SUBJECT CHOICE

We have now collated all reply slips. Out of the 57 learners, 48 have opted for Mathematics and of which 38 have selected Physical Sciences. End of this year these subjects will be finalised as per the Subject Policy. To avoid any disappointment, we kindly request that all parents, with their daughters, read carefully through the Subject Policy (found at the back of the booklet that was handed out). Term 4's mark for Mathematics will determine whether your daughter will take Mathematics and Physical Sciences in 2025.

PRELIM EXAMS / FINAL ORAL AND PRACTICAL EXAMS

Our matrics started with their Prelim exams on 19 August 2024. We have requested that learners be at school during line-up to eliminate any stress. Although exams start at 9h00, it is important that your daughter be at school at least an hour before for administration purposes. Learners that arrive after 8h30 will have to wait outside the exam venue until 9h00. Learners that arrive after 9h00 forfeit the time lost while learners who arrive after 10h00 will forfeit the exam. All learners have received a timetable and it has been uploaded onto our website. We have had our final oral external moderation for English HL which went off very well. The Dramatic Arts and Consumer Studies practical exams have also been done. Once again our learners have excelled.

The saying, "If you want to go fast, go alone, but if you want to go far, go together," will continue to guide us as we move forward, united in our purpose and commitment to each other.




Re-registration 2025

Re-registration/data verification forms will be sent out via email on Friday. Please make the necessary changes on the form and re-submit it electronically to the school by Friday, 6 September. The link you receive is specific to each learner so if you have more than one child you need to complete a form for each one of your children. If you have not received a form please contact Mrs Stoman via email on admin@loreto.co.za

Should your child NOT be returning to Loreto Convent School in 2025 please send an email to admin@loreto.co.za by NO LATER than the 31st of October 2024.

If you are unable to print the Parent declaration, Permission and consent form, Indemnity form and the Contract sections that need to be signed and returned to Mrs Stoman (admin office) kindly send an email to admin@loreto.co.za with your child's name and grade so that I can send you a hard copy.

The re-registration fee is R6000 for all Primary and High School learners which forms part of the January school fees for 2025 and is payable by 31 October 2024.
